ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE

HOLY ORDER OF MANS

ARTICLE ONE:

Name

The name of this corporation is the HOLY ORDER

OF MANS

ARTICLE TWO:

Purposes

A. Primary purposes

The specific and primary purposes for which this corporation is formed are the worship of God and the service to God, the Great Creative Force of this Universe, to preserve the ancient Christian Wisdom Teachings for the coming generation as they were taught in ancient of days. This is to fulfill a mission revealed by the Higher Order of the Holy Cross, through revelation.

B. General purposes

The further purposes of this corporation are:

- 1. To teach and prepare student ministers, Lay Brothers, and Lay Sisters, for counseling and administering through the seminary for the service of God. By teaching all that was taught by the Master Jesus, and other Great Masters before Him, for the perpetuation of a full and perfect balance of Body, Mind, and Soul.
- 2. To teach Christ without dogmatism, or creedal stand; to serve all man for Christ, thus, bringing about World Brotherhood, which is the Love of God working through man for his brother.
- 3. To publish and print truth, establish brotherhouses, seminaries, missions, youth guidance centers, and clinics.
- 4. To defend, with Peace and Light, the right accordance to the Word of the New Testament. We are defenders of the Truth.
- 5. To have a Holy Order of avowed brothers, and sisters, seeking Illumination and the Realization of God, and are vowed into the service of God, under the Order of Melchezedek, on an Apostolic Mission of Divine Origin.
- 6. It is also accepted that there is to be but one world Holy Order of Mans.
- 7. To take, receive, acquire, hold, manage, and administer property, funds and monies of, and for, the use of the said Holy Order of Mans, or for other

religious benevolent educational purroses.

- 8. To do all necessary, or convenient, to carry out and administer to the needs of the Spirit, Mind, Soul, and Body, for the Glory of God, and obtain the above specified purposes to the same extent as natural persons might, or could do.
- 9. To engage in any business, or activities, related to the purposes set forth in this Article Two, and, from time to time, authorized, or approved, by the Board of Directors of this corporation, all such business and activity; however, to be without pecuniary profit to any member, or members, of this corporation.
- 10. To do all things, and have, and exercise, all rights and powers, which a non-profit corporation may do, have, or exercise, under the laws of the State of California, provided, however, that notwithstanding and statement of purposes, or powers, heretofore set forth in this Article Two of the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity, or exercise any power, that is not in furtherance of its religious purposes as specifically set forth in Article Two of these Articles of Incorporation. property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable, or religious purposes, and upon liquidation, dissolution, or abandonment, of the owner, after providing for the debts and obligations thereof, the remaining assets will not inure to the benefit of any private person, but will be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation, which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, or religious, purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- a statement of both purposes and powers, and shall not be limited by reference to, or inference, from one another, but each such purpose clause shall be construed as a separate statement conferring independent purposes and powers on the corporation.

ARTICLE THREE: Principle office

The principle office for the transaction of the business of the corporation is located in the city, and county, of San Francisco.

ARTICLE FOUR: Non-Profit corporation

This corporation is organized pursuant to the General Non-Profit Corporation Law of California.

ARTICLE SIX: Members; officers

The number and qualifications of members, the classes of membership and the voting, proprietary, and other rights and privileges, and the dues, assessments and other obligations of each class of members shall be set forth in and regulated by the By-laws of the corporation, provided, however, that any member may be suspended from active participation of membership exceeding not more than six (6) months if found, by the Esoteric Council and local board of

the corporation, to have been guilty of wilful, or malicious defamation.

ARTICLE SEVEN: Term; disposition of assets

This corporation shall be permanent and shall have no fixed term of existence, provided, however, that it may be disolved by its members as provided by law.

Upon the dissolution, or other termination, of the existence of this corporation, after payment, or satisfaction of its debts, or obligations, its remaining funds and assets shall be delivered to the San Francisco Branch of the Florence Crittendon Home, City of San Francisco, County of San Francisco, State of California, or in the event such institution shall refuse, or be unable to accept the same for any reason, then such remaining funds and assets shall be delivered to the Boy Scouts of America.

Re: Exemption from franchise tax

Gentlemen:

It is the opinion of this office, based upon the evidence presented, that you are exempt from State franchise tax under the provisions of Section 23701d of the Revenue and Taxation Code, as it is shown that you are organized and operated exclusively as a religious organization.

Accordingly, you will not be required to file franchise tax returns unless you change the character of your organization, the purposes for which you were organized, or your method of operation. You are required to report any such changes immediately so that their effect on your exempt status may be determined.

Contributions made to you are deductible by the donors in arriving at their taxable net income in the manner and to the extent provided by Sections 17214, 17215, 17216 and 24357 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

If your organization is not yet incorporated and has not yet qualified to do business in California, this approval will expire unless incorporation or qualification is completed within thirty days.
