However, due to the high costs of printing and mailing from the United States, we have only been able to produce 10,000 copies of each issue. This, of course, is only a small fraction of the numbers required to fill the need.

A spiritual vacuum has been created by the communist "experiment" in the country formerly known as *Holy Russia*. The present-day moment of

freedom is a crucial one. It is vitally important to send literature and missionaries now while the doors are open and hearts are eager for spiritual food. At this moment the spiritual void is being rapidly filled by all kinds of pseudo-spiritualities which are foreign and disturbing to the Russian soul, with its 1,000-year history of mystical experience of Jesus Christ.

# RUSSKY PALOMNIK—RUSSIAN PILGRIM RETURNS

One of the most popular journals in pre-revolutionary Russia was *Russky Palomnik (Russian Pilgrim)*. For over thirty years it fed Russians with solid Christian writings designed to keep faith in Christ alive and active. Publication naturally ceased with the Revolution of 1917.

In 1990, a group of young Americans took upon itself the task of publishing Russky Palomnik and distributing it in Russia to the thousands who are thirsting for genuine, unadulterated Christian literature in their own language. The response has been phenom-


